Highlighting

Highlighting brings out the high points of your face. Use a highlighter that's a few shades lighter than your skin. Apply it to the tops of your cheekbones, down the bridge of your nose, and on your brow bone. For a natural glow, use a cream or liquid highlighter.

<u>The Eyes – Defining and Accentuating</u>

Your eyes are one of the most expressive parts of your face, and there are endless ways to enhance them.

Eyebrows

Well-defined eyebrows frame your face and make a big difference. Use a pencil, powder, or pomade that matches your brow color. Lightly fill in sparse areas, following the natural shape of your brows. Set with a clear brow gel to keep them in place all day.

Eyeshadow

Choose shades that complement your eye color and desired look.

Neutral Tones

Perfect for a natural look or daytime wear.

Smokey Eyes

Use dark shades like charcoal, navy, or brown for drama. Apply a light base color all over the lid, a medium shade in the crease, and a darker shade near the lash line for depth.

Eyeliner

Eyeliner can make your eyes look larger and more defined.

Pencil Eyeliner

Pencil eyeliner is great for a softer look.

Gel Eyeliner

Provides bold definition and lasts longer.

Liquid Eyeliner

Best for creating sharp, precise lines or winged eyeliner.
